## **Ferrarone Team Race Intersectional**

### **April 4-5, 2009**

Saturday: The breeze started out strong, but continued to build as the day went on. The wind came from the West. The teams had a tough time keeping stable combinations because of the multiple puffs and shifts. As the day went on, large, rolling waves swept in from Long Island Sound. In the morning, the normal breeze was 15 knots with puffs to 20. That was just the start of the carnage, though, with

numerous boats flipping before the sequence, during the sequence, at the start, on the legs, at the mark roundings and even right at and after the finish line. The wind continued to build, with the highest recorded puff clocked at 35 knots. It was not uncommon for boats to be flogging both the main and jib and fully hiked and occasionally capsizing to windward. By the end of the day, there more than 30 capsizes had occurred. In all, 45 races were sailed, with three protests filed. Two protests were disallowed the other resulted in a disqualification for Boston College.

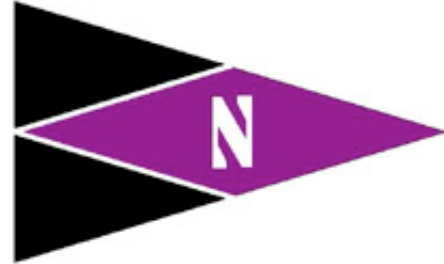

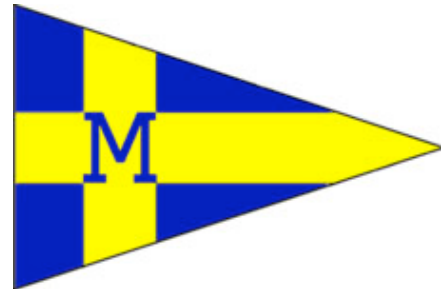
