## **Freshman Icebreaker Notre Dame March 24-25, 2007**

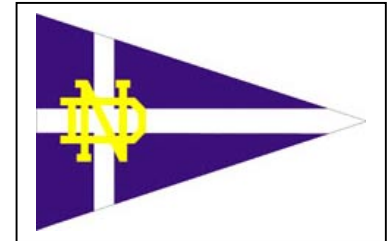

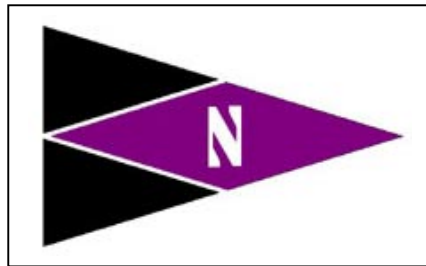
**Jeremy McIntyre Team Race
